# What is TAP?

The Traveling ArtsReach Program (TAP) is a free arts enrichment program designed to give students in grades 1-5 the opportunity to learn about “Master Artists” as they increase their artistic literacy.

Students will be introduced to examples of master artist’s work and will use these as inspiration for their own 2-dimensional masterpiece. All materials will be provided for each TAP program and all of the volunteers are thoroughly trained by seasoned visual art educators and have BCSD Volunteer Badges.

## Arts Integrated Curriculum

Along with covering SC Visual Arts Standards, each lesson also includes learning objectives from one or more other subject areas. Our lesson plans are strategically written to incorporate SC math, science, and/or social studies standards for each particular grade level.

Following the art activity, students will interpret and evaluate their final works as they present them to one another, making connections to their learning.

## 1st Grade

### Zooming in on Nature – with Georgia O’Keeffe

This lesson will take students on a search as they zoom through nature by looking closely at flowers. They will draw the lines and the shapes that they see, and create their own abstracted flowers by adding colors while being inspired by the works of Georgia O’Keeffe.



## 2nd Grade

### Visualizing Van Gogh: Starry Night Over my Neighborhood

This lesson will take students into the world of Vincent Van Gogh, and have them consider their own community and neighborhoods. Through drawing and visual imagery students will create “Starry Night Over their Neighborhood” works using the style of Van Gogh through lines and colors.



## 3rd Grade

### Kandinsky + Math = Awesome Abstractions

Students will identify a variety of 2-dimensional shapes in the work of Wassily Kandinsky and use similar shapes and lines to create a Kandinsky inspired art work. Who knew that creating a beautiful piece of art could be a perfect math assessment tool?!



## 4th Grade

### Picasso Inspired Portraits

Students will be inspired by the cubistic portraits of Pablo Picasso and discuss the use of math in his works. They will also learn about their own facial features and the importance of measuring and then create their own cubistic portraits in his style.



## 5th Grade

### Warhol Inspired POP Art Prints

Students will be introduced to the effects of consumerism in America during the Cold War era and learn how it impacted the art world. Through interpreting the works of iconic POP Artist Andy Warhol we will explore the wonderful world of POP Culture then students will create their own series of prints, using a block printing technique.
